MSF Milestones

1994

MSF Hong Kong was established this year, after 6 years of providing medical care to Vietnamese boat people in camps in Hong Kong. The first batch of fieldworkers recruited by the Hong Kong office were assigned to Kenya and southern Sudan (now South Sudan).







We started lobbying the Hong Kong Hospital Authority (HA) to give more flexibility for its employees to take leave for humanitarian work. HA created a policy in 2000 to allow staff to take a one year, unpaid leave to carry out relief work overseas. This year, we supported MSF emergency teams to respond to floods in many provinces in Mainland China, including Anhui, Guangxi, Guizhou, Hebei, Hunan and Zhejiang.

1999

MSF was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, further establishing it as one of the world's leading medical humanitarian organisations and earning the respect of the Hong Kong public.



PROFITEERING PREAT HIV/AID

2001

Organised our first public petition to support MSF's global campaign to stop 39 pharmaceutical companies' lawsuit against the South African government on the use of generic medicines for reasons of public health. Over 5,300 of the nearly 300,000 signatures collected were from Hong Kong.

2003

MSF responded to the SARS outbreak in Vietnam, Hong Kong and mainland China. In Hong Kong, we ran health education sessions in the community, donated medical protective equipment and trained health workers on infection prevention and control in certain public hospitals.





2008

We made 18 departures of field workers to the Sichuan earthquake response. We also donated supplies and tents, provided support to hospital patients suffering from 'crush syndrome', assisted a triage centre, and provided psychological care to survivors of the earthquake.

2013

We provided significant direct operational support to the Typhoon Haiyan emergency response in the Philippines, also contributed in terms of financial, administrative, logistical, and communication support.





2014

In response to the Ebola outbreak in West Africa, we deployed 23 field workers from Hong Kong to join MSF teams on the ground to contain the epidemic.

2020

We responded to waves of the COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong, focusing on providing accurate and important medical information to vulnerable groups, and partnering with local NGOs to offer free medical consultations and vaccinations in the later stage of the pandemic. A mental health website was also launched to offer tips and tools to help cope with the stress caused by prolonged uncertainty.

Over the years, we have been profoundly moved by the countless messages of encouragement from our donors. Although we have never met most of you, your heartfelt words convey a warmth that deeply touches our hearts. Many donors often say their contributions are insignificant compared to the efforts of our frontline staff, but in reality, your unwavering support is the cornerstone of our numerous relief missions. Hong Kong may seem like a tiny dot on the map, but for the past thirty years, the collective goodwill of its people has formed a brilliant force, illuminating countless lives.





From Hong Kong to the Front Lines: A Story of Global Aid



"How can I go further and truly help more people in need?" This is a question that Beatrice often pondered during her journey with MSF. "Initially, I was attracted by MSF's fundraising philosophy. It tries to keep government funding to a minimum, which allows the organisation to remain neutral and truly practice impartiality—regardless of politics, religion, or race. If you need medical care, we provide it." Beatrice left the banking sector and joined MSF (Hong Kong) as the Fundraising Director, a role she held for eight years before she further devotes herself to the front lines.

"On the front lines, you realise that sometimes having resources is not enough to carry out relief work," Beatrice said. When faced with sudden crises, many humanitarian organisations are constrained by political pressures or lengthy funding application processes, preventing them from taking swift action. However, MSF can often deploy a relief team within 48 hours.

Looking back, she realises how far she has come. "I think it's the unwavering commitment of the people of Hong Kong that has kept me going. During my time as the Fundraising Director in Hong Kong, I witnessed the immense generosity of Hong Kong people during the 2008 Sichuan earthquake, the 2010 Haiti earthquake, and the 2011 Japan tsunami. This sense of solidarity has always driven me to keep moving forward."

Across the Globe: Bringing International Aid Experience, Witnessing the Strength of Hong Kong



This year marks Borrie's fifteenth with MSF. Last year, he travelled halfway across the globe from South Africa to Hong Kong. Before, he has worked with MSF in Zambia, Malawi, Mozambique, Kenya, Uganda, India, and Pakistan.

With his global perspective, Borrie has observed the unique qualities of MSF Hong Kong. "The frontline aid workers recruited here are highly skilled, diverse, and incredibly passionate professionals. They often take on significant responsibilities in some of the most challenging missions, serving in long-term senior roles and providing essential stability to team-oriented relief projects."

A Journey of Humanitarian Dedication: From Early Efforts to MSF



Rita's career has always been rooted in humanitarian work.

During the 2004 South Asian tsunami, her collaboration with MSF through her previous organisation made a profound impact on her. In 2011, Rita officially joined MSF as a field worker.

Her first MSF assignment was in India as an HR and Finance Manager, followed by missions in South Sudan, Sierra Leone, Pakistan, and Afghanistan. In 2018, she joined MSF Hong Kong, focusing on recruiting field workers across Asia.

"MSF Hong Kong has not only greatly supported international relief work through fundraising but also provided stable and excellent professionals who play crucial roles in projects worldwide," Rita said. Since 2001, MSF Hong Kong has recruited over 800 international staff, some serving as technical advisors, trainers, or decision-makers for MSF's future development.

"Having worked with MSF for over a decade, my experiences across the globe have strengthened my belief in our mission and values. On the front line, I have seen firsthand how MSF prioritises patients, providing free, high-quality medical services under the most challenging conditions, always treating everyone equally."



Expenditure


